Appearance Rules of Conduct

1. MRF/MTRF shall be dressed appropriately during appearances. This includes but is not limited to banners, crown and buckles. Jeans or pants should always be non-faded and starched, shirts should be crisp and starched, boots shall be shined, with the black of the soles blackened, the buckle and crown should always be kept clean and shiny, the banner shall be ironed and tucked accordingly with the outfit, the hat shall be clean and properly shaped. The queen(s) hair should be curled or styled in a manner acceptable by the MRF committee. Makeup is a must! Always check lipstick and keep powder on your face to look your best. During air travel, MRF/MTRF is required to wear crown, buckle, and sash. Always double check makeup, hair and clothing prior to arriving at your destination.
2. MRF/MTRF shall always mind her manners during appearances. Absolutely no tobacco products or profanity shall be tolerated. She shall be kind and gracious to everyone. If a situation arises that she feels is inappropriate, she shall contact a member of the MRF board and follow the instructions of the board. She shall always remember to thank her hosts before departing and follow up with a written thank you note within one week.
3. MRF/MTRF shall refrain from chewing gum during appearances. (Choose breath mints or breath strips instead).
4. MRF/MTRF shall always show up at scheduled appearances. She shall arrive at appearances at least one hour early. She will allow extra time to get to appearances in case she encounters problems. She will be ready when she arrives. She will not show up with hair in curlers or lacking proper wardrobe or make-up. She will always introduce herself to the person in charge of the event and ask what she can do to help them or what they expect of her during the appearance. If it is a rodeo, she will have her bio card ready for the announcer when she arrives. Rodeo Announcers must plan well in advance of the start the rodeo. You cannot give them information just prior to the show and expect to be recognized. Last minute changes are one of rodeo announcers' biggest pet peeves. Do not put yourself in that situation or you will quickly lose their respect.
5. MRF/MTRF shall be dressed in queen attire until she leaves the appearance.
6. MRF/MTRF shall not be in nightclub or bar establishments unless it is an event sanctioned by the MRF board.
7. MRF/MTRF shall limit cell phone use during appearances.

Appearance Rules of Conduct Continued

8. MRF/MTRF boyfriend shall not be present during appearances. **No Men** will be allowed in hotel rooms with the exception of queen(s) father or brother.

9. MRF/MTRF shall mind her reputation at all times. She will treat the cowboys and young men at her appearances as she would a co-worker. She shall be gracious during her appearance but will not entertain them after her appearance has ended. No public display of affection (including handholding will be tolerated).

10. If both MRF and MTRF are both present at an event, MRF shall take the lead and MTRF shall follow. MTRF shall always remember that she is an understudy to the queen and will conduct herself accordingly.

11. MTRF shall be in the presence of a chaperone during all appearances. At all Florida events, the chaperone must be a parent or MRF committee member. A chaperone may be assigned at any out-of-state events.

12. If you are staying in a host home MRF/MTRF shall always be tidy, respectful of the host home and be courteous. (E.g., make bed every morning, do not scatter clothes about your room, do not leave make-up scattered about the bathroom, clean up after yourself) Offer to assist your host/hostess with small household chores, never enter their home after you are scheduled to be in without good cause, mind your manners and send a thank you note immediately for them hosting you during your stay.

Remember as MRF/MTRF you are a role model to many people during an appearance. Conduct yourself as if you were an employee of the sponsor of that event. Respect yourself, the committee, and your title at all times.
